

1999 Intel Science Talent Search

*\$330,000 in scholarships will be awarded in the 58th Annual Science Talent Search
for research projects in science, mathematics and engineering*

Introduction—Applications for the 1999 Intel Science Talent Search (STS) are now available for students interested in participating in this prestigious science competition. This is the first year Intel will sponsor the STS, America's oldest and most highly regarded pre-college science competition. The STS was previously sponsored by Westinghouse.

Basic Requirements—Entrants must be in their last year of secondary school during the 1998-99 school year. Primary emphasis is placed on a written report of an independent research project in the physical sciences, behavioral and social sciences, engineering, mathematics, or biological sciences (excluding live vertebrate experimentation). The research project must be the work of a single individual. Group projects are not eligible. An Entry Form, designed to elicit evidence of creativity and interest in science, is also required, along with an official high school transcript, available standardized test scores, and statements and recommendations from teachers and/or supervising scientists.

Winners Selection—A team of evaluators and judges specializing in a variety of scientific disciplines will select 300 Semifinalists. These Semifinalists will receive certificates of achievement for both themselves and their teachers and recommendations to colleges and universities for admission and financial assistance.

From these 300 Semifinalists, 40 Finalists will be selected. These Finalists will receive a six-day, all-expenses-paid trip to the Science Talent Institute in Washington, DC to participate in final judging and a chance to share in \$330,000 in scholarships.

Important Note—Sons and daughters of Science Service employees or Science Talent Search evaluators and judges are not eligible for competition.
