Were our brains hard-wired in the Pleistocene era by the needs of hunter-gatherers?

When did religious beliefs first emerge?

Why were the first paintings made by humankind so technically accomplished and expressive?

What can the sexual habits of chimpanzees tell us about the prehistory of the modern mind?

This is the first archaeological account to support the modular concept of the mind. The concept, promulgated by cognitive and evolutionary psychologists, views the mind as a collection of specialized intelligences, or cognitive domains, somewhat like a Swiss army knife with its

ins, somewhat like a Swiss army knife with it specialized blades and tools. Arguing that only archaeology can answer many of the key questions raised by this new concept, Steven Mithen delineates a three-phase sequence for the mind's evolution over 6 million years—from early *Homo* in Africa to the Neandertals during the ice age, to our modern, modular minds.

Here is an intriguing and challenging explanation of what it means to be human, and a bold new theory about the origins and nature of the mind. —from Thames and Hudson
