









In Mind of the Raven, Bernd Heinrich, award-winning naturalist, finds himself dreaming of ravens and decides he must get to the truth about this animal, reputed to be so intelligent.

Throughout history, the relationship between humans and ravens has been extraordinary. Ravens, like early humans, are scavengers on the kills of great carnivores. As scavengers, ravens were associated with the hunters they found in the north—wolves and, later, men. The trinity of wolf, man, and raven in the hunt is an extremely ancient one. In considering the appeal of the raven, Heinrich suspects that a meeting of the minds might reside in that hunting trinity.

Heinrich's passion for ravens has led him around the world. Mind of the Raven takes you on an exotic journey—from New England to Germany and from Montana to Baffin Island in the high Arctic—offering dazzling accounts of how science works in the field, filtered through the eyes of a passionate observer of nature.

You must also understand what you see"—Heinrich enables us to see the natural world through the eyes of a scientist.
