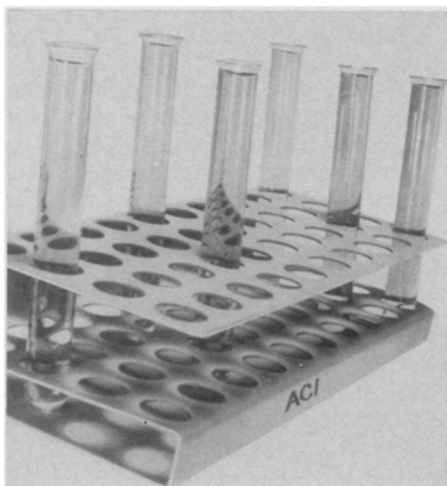

Crystal polishing kit

A complete crystal polishing kit provides in a convenient package all the materials necessary for grinding, polishing and buffing operations on commonly used materials such as salt, potassium bromide and cesium bromide. The kit contains a mahogany base, ground glass pads, a spring holder, felt pads, both coarse and fine abrasives, a polishing compound and camel hair brushes. Grid patterns for designers

Electrical and electronic designers can realize substantial improvements in dimensioning tolerances and overall drawing accuracy by using a new line of high-stability, precision grid patterns.

The patterns are on 0.0075-inch base Mylar. The grid may be used as an underlay to serve as a guide, or a layout can be made directly on the grid, eliminating the need for a light table. Line spaces are accurate to within ± 0.002 inch over 48 inches and ± 0.0005 inch between any two lines. Sheets come in five sizes, ranging from 8x24 inches to 36x48 inches.
