Females arrive, and courtship, building of nest, caring for young are shown. At the summer's end, swallows migrate back to the southern climate from whence they came. Bird cries and mating call are included on sound track. Animated map traces migration routes between North America and Brazil. Audience: junior high. THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE. 16mm, b&w, sound, 28 min. Story of a well-intentioned attempt by management to solve a foreman's problems by sending him and his colleagues to training courses. But training, as the film shows, is not enough. Although the foreman's relationships with other departments can be improved by courses, the advantages of training are lost if the attitude of management remains basically unchanged itself. Only when management provides better organization and supervision can the training of foremen and others be fully exploited. Audience: management, students in supervisory training courses. MOLTON SALT REACTOR EXPERIMENT. 16mm, color, sound, 20 min. Describes the design, construction and operation of the Molten Salt Reactor Experiment (MSRE). Developmental work prior to fabricating many of the reactor's major components, such as the reactor vessels and salt-to-air radiator, is also presented. Audience: professional.
