CERAMICS IN ART AND INDUSTRY. 16mm, color, sound, 17 min. Traces history of ceramics from the ancient potter's wheel to modern ceramic material applications in nuclear reactor parts, tiny ceramic memory cells and nose cones for missiles. Shows new techniques such as cylindrical pieces being formed on a rotating jigger, and unsymmetrical hollow wave being made by pouring the liquid slip into plaster-of-paris molds ready for firing in the kiln and glazing. 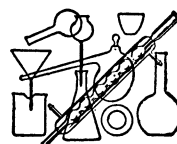

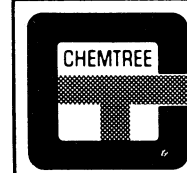

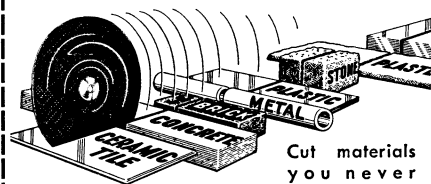
