We should not expect that matter should behave in other environments in the fashions which are familiar to us in our limited view. In fact, the conditions which we know directly may actually represent one of the more extreme conditions existing in the universe.

It is encouraging to see, at last, the beginning of developments which may lead to reassessment of constructions based on the so-called red shift and ultimately, as one hopes, to a clearer understanding of the physical universe.
