Sago starch, used for adhesives and sizing, comes from the pithy center of the East Indies sago palm tree.

The "tin can" is about 99% steel, yet its extremely thin tin plating accounts for more than half the tin consumption in the U.S.

The first nuclear *reactor* for industrial research will be established at Armour Research Foundation of Illinois Institute of Technology, Chicago.

Made from the root of the cassava plant, *tapioca* is used for food and as a postage stamp adhesive.
