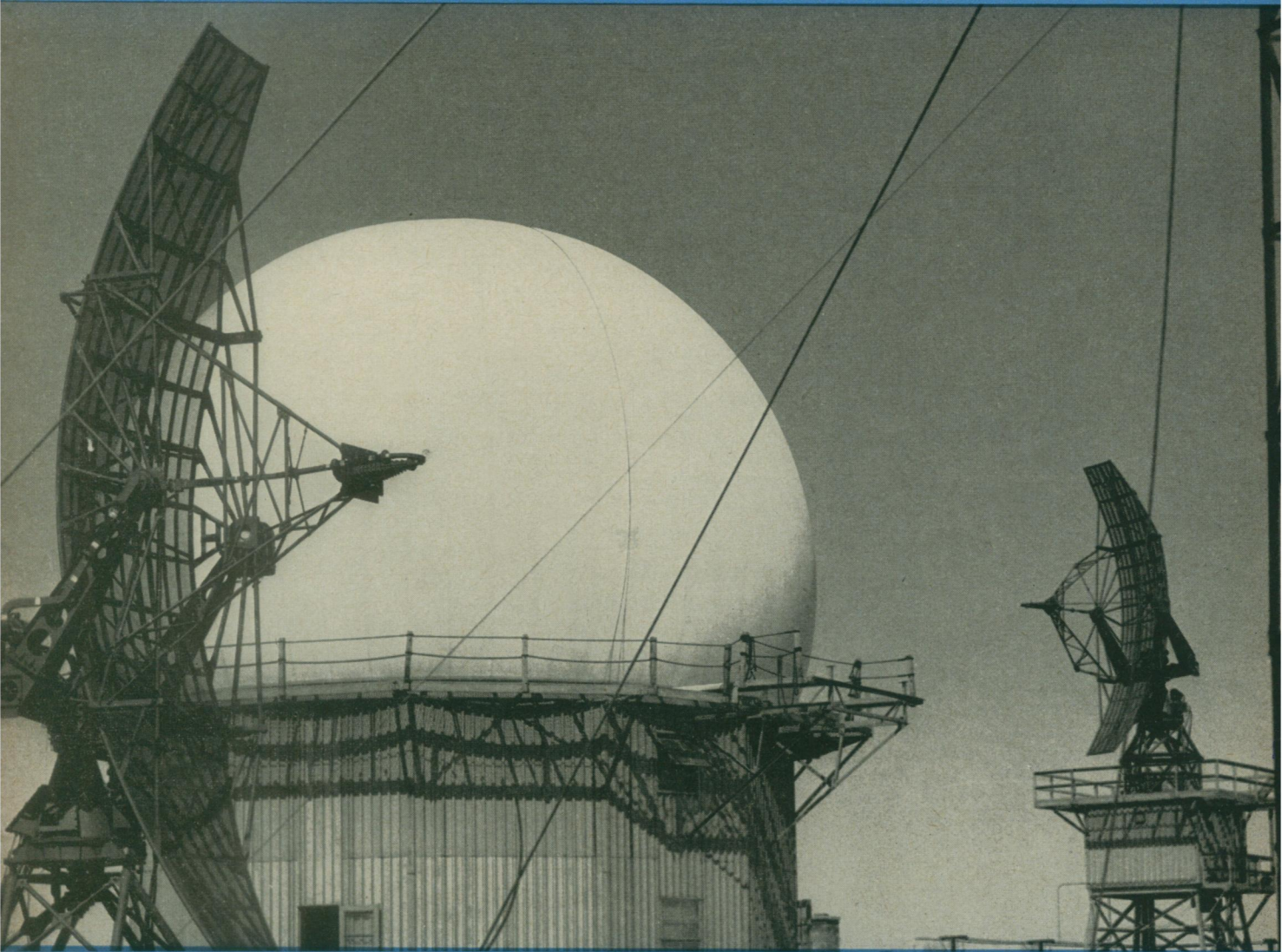

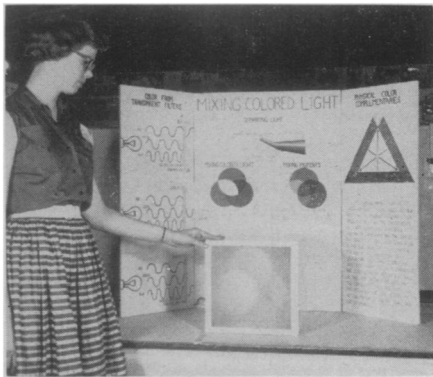
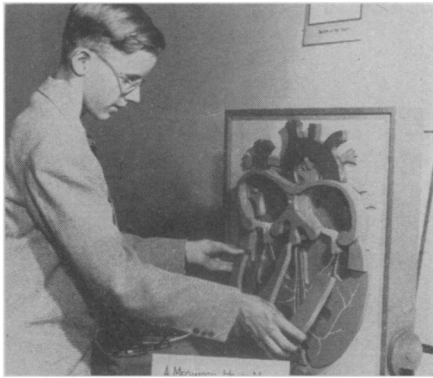

ARE YOU IN THE SCIENCE FAIR?

Every regional science fair in the country is invited. Science Clubs of America will be glad to cooperate with areas planning a local fair. Step-by-step know-how is sent to interested community-minded organizations who cover the costs of conducting the science fair, the entry fee to the National Science Fair, housing and transportation for finalists and accompanying newsmen and educators. Sophomores, juniors and seniors, chosen as finalists in their local fairs, are eligible for entry in the National Science Fair in Cleveland.



START NOW

Plan your exhibit early and develop it as you get new, effective ideas during the coming months. Make it clear-cut, dramatic. Your teachers can do much to guide and assist you. Only individuals and their exhibits are accepted in the national event.

COOPERATING ORGANIZATIONS

Newspapers, colleges and universities, scientific societies and civic groups planned and financed 50 area fairs sending finalists to the Fifth National Science Fair at Purdue University. At least 75 regions in the country will enter the Sixth National Science Fair in Cleveland. Will your group be there?

NATIONAL SCIENCE FAIR AWARDS

Each finalist attending the Cleveland meeting will receive a silver medal with the gold SCA insignia on the face; on the reverse is engraved the name of the entrant and sponsoring organization. Each school will be given a Certificate of Award with a facsimile of the medal.

"Wish Awards" of scientific material, equipment, books, etc., are selected by the winning students for their future study in science: four First (\$125), four Second (\$75), four Third (\$50) each, plus Fourth Awards of \$25 each, up to 25% of remaining finalists, at the discretion of the judges, to a total of more than \$1,500.

AT CLEVELAND

Special privileges will be extended to Official Party—finalists and accompanying adults—by the Case Institute of Technology, Western Reserve University, scientific industries and civic centers.

The amazing growth of the National Science Fair is shown by the accompanying graph. Now coast-to-coast, NSF will show the work of finalists from all parts of the country.
