ATLAS OF NEUROPATHOLOGY—Nathan Malamud—University of California Press, 468 p., illus., \$20.00. The wealth of photomicrographs provides a visual approach not usual in textbooks on this subject.

BIOENERGETICS—Albert Szent-Györgyi—Academic, 143 p., illus., \$4.50. In biochemistry, the author points out, highlights of knowledge exist side by side with profound ignorance.

This work is intended to attempt to identify the missing link in our knowledge.

CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY OF EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN—C. M. Louttit and others—Harper, 3d ed., 573 p., illus., \$6.00. Although there is one chapter devoted to the gifted child, most of the book discusses the retarded and those with special problems or defects. Apparently this revision was completed before Dr. Louttit's sudden

death, since he signed the preface in March, 1956.

Advice on all aspects of child care and protection from how to diaper the infant to how to keep the older child from being led away by strangers.

FLAT TOP RANCH: The Story of a Grassland Venture-Louis Bromfield and others—University of Oklahoma Press, 232 p., illus., \$4.00. Containing the last writing of Louis Bromfield before his death and describing how worn-out land in Texas was converted to a successful ranch with "good grass, good water, and good cattle."

THE FRIENDLY FUNGI: A New Approach to the Eelworm Problem — C. L. Duddington — Faber and Faber, 188 p., illus., 21 shillings or about \$3.00. A non-technical book originating in England where the eelworm costs several million pounds a year in damage to farm crops. It can be controlled, the author indicates, by encouraging the fungi that prey on it.
