Tropical Storms Predicted Soon

➤ ABOUT THREE tropical storms, from which full-fledged hurricanes develop, may possibly form before the middle of September, the U.S. Weather Bureau's Miami office has predicted.

Two of them are predicted to develop east of the Lesser Antilles or near the Bahama Islands, and one of these is forecast to move northwestward toward the South Atlantic states or the Gulf states. The other, the Weather Bureau predicted in its "hurricane probability" forecast issued for the first time this season on an experimental basis, should recurve northward into the Atlantic Ocean without striking the U. S. coast.

Development of one storm in the Gulf of Mexico appears probable, the long-range weather experts predict.

The experimental forecasts are based on current 30-day weather forecast and historical data. In the past 70 years, the period of mid-August to mid-September has had more tropical storm activity than any other 30-day period. The average number is three storms, and the record number is eight.

During this period there have been at least two tropical storms every year since 1941. The most favored areas of formation are normally the Lesser Antilles and the eastern Atlantic, but more than half these storms remain at sea.
