#### **New Blood Factor** Found in Bleeders

➤ A NEW ANTI-BLOOD clotting factor has been found in the blood of persons with hemophilia and Christmas disease, two poorly understood "bleeding" disorders.

The blood in these persons refuses to clot normally and even a minor bruise or cut can have serious consequences.

The new-found anticoagulant bears no resemblance to any anti-clotting substance that has been previously reported, Drs. F. Nour-Eldin and John F. Wilkinson, University of Manchester, England, report in Nature (Nov. 9).

The blood disorders are believed due to the lack of one or another of the blood clotting factors found in normal blood.

Studies of blood taken from 123 persons with the disorders showed that in addition to lacking these necessary components, the blood also contained a substance that was actively restricting the formation of clots.

The anticoagulant is present at birth and is found in the plasma and not in blood serum.

"It is now our opinion that the defect in these two diseases is produced by a deficiency in a blood clotting factor as well as by the presence of this anticoagulant," the scientists say. .

The amount of the anticoagulant in the blood greatly affects the condition of patients with the disorder, they conclude. A name was not given to the newly discovered anticoagulant.
